

From the March 2002 Grapevine

IT WAS LIKE waking up in the middle of a nightmare, and being unable to escape its spell and fall back to sleep again. Finally, after almost twenty years of denial, anger, and frustration, I was sitting in the day room of an alcohol recovery center with the shakes.

I sat with my elbows on my knees, staring at the floor, twirling my key ring on my finger. The people at the recovery center had told me very plainly that my life was in jeopardy, that my drinking had led me to a point where a choice had to be made. That choice was mine alone. The choice had always been mine, and I had always chosen to drink. Then, they told me I had another choice--recovery. What a strange word to a man who wasn't even sick! Or was I?

I stared again at the key ring and began to dissect the meaning behind each piece of metal on that band. There were the keys to my car. How many times had I seated myself behind the wheel of that machine while completely unable to control myself because I was drunk? God, it was a miracle that no one had injured or killed because of this thing they called a sickness in mealcoholism. There were other keys on the ring, none of which held any special importance--a small mailbox key here, a key labeled "Storage Shed" there. What storage shed? More mist and confusion.

I fumbled through the pocket of my coat and found yet another key, this one to a motel room, and a cheap one at that. More was coming back to me as I recalled an angry wife ordering me from the house, children crying, and curious neighbors looking on, trying not to be obvious witnesses to the breakup that was occurring right on their own street. I began to realize what they had known for years: I was just a drunk, nothing but a drunk.

Still more memories returned: renting a stall to store what few personal possessions I had left; moving into the motel room, where I stomped in anger, screamed in rage, and finally wallowed in self-pity and depression as I tried to drink away my rejection.

The key ring came back to mind as I realized there was one key that was not on the ring anymore: the key to my house. More fear built up in my ragged mind as I realized that when I left this recovery center, there would be no place for me to go. For the first time in my life, I had no home. No key. Those moments were undoubtedly the lowest of my life. In my early stages of recovery, the thought that there was no place for me to go kept me in a state of panic. Then, slowly, as things became more clear to me, I realized that I had been going nowhere for a good many years; had I continued, all the keys on all the rings in the world couldn't have saved me.

It was later, following the completion of my Fifth Step, that I found the real key to my life. It was the AA program, which had been the key for hundreds of thousands of others just like me. With that key firmly in hand, I can unlock doors that would have otherwise been bolted to me forever.
